

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR LIMITED ACCESS STREETS

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of St. Charles has previously entered into an Annexation Agreement with the St. Charles Country Club dated August 4, 1986, first amended on February 15, 1988, and again amended March 20, 1989, which Agreement limits the number of curb cuts along Country Club Road to a main entrance and maintenance entrance along the north side of the road and a maintenance entrance along the south side of the road.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES, KANE AND DU PAGE COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

1. That Title 10, "Vehicles and Traffic," Chapter 10.11, "Rules of the Road," of the St. Charles Municipal Code, be and is hereby amended by adding Section 10.11.1910, "Limited Access Streets," as follows:

**"10.11.1910 Limited access streets.**

There shall be no curb cuts along Country Club Road from the centerline of Illinois Route 25 to a point 2,446 feet easterly thereof on the north side and to a point 856.6 feet easterly thereof on the south side, except the following:

(1) The curb cut forming the main entrance to the St. Charles Country Club property on the north side of Country Club Road shall be approximately 1,880 feet easterly of the centerline line of Illinois Route 25.

(2) A second curb cut on the north side of Country Club Road shall be at a point approximately 869 feet easterly of the centerline line of Illinois Route 25 and shall be

used for grounds maintenance vehicles only and shall have a gate which is closed at all times other than when used by such grounds maintenance vehicles.

(3) A third curb cut on the south side of Country Club Road shall be at a point approximately 841 feet easterly of the centerline line of Illinois Route 25 and shall be used for grounds maintenance vehicles only and shall have a gate which is closed at all times other than when used by such grounds maintenance vehicles."


2. Any person who violates the provisions of this Ordinance shall be fined not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense.

3. That after the adoption and approval hereof the Ordinance shall (i) be printed or published in book or pamphlet form, published by the authority of the Council, or (ii) within thirty (30) days after the adoption and approval hereof, be published in a newspaper published in and with a general circulation within the City of St. Charles.
