BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST.
CHARLES, KANE AND DUPAGE COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, as follows:

1. THAT TITLE 8, "Health and Safety," Chapter 8.24
"Garbage and Refuse," of the St. Charles Municipal Code be and is
hereby amended by deleting Section 8.24.010 "Definitions," and
substituting the following therefore:

"8.24.010 Definitions.

As used in this chapter, the following words shall have the
meanings ascribed to them as follows:

- A. "Garbage and Rubbish" means:
1. All household and kitchen wastes, such as discarded food or food residues and paper used for wrapping same, books, newspapers, boxes, cartons, aluminum, tin cans, bottles, non-combustible trash (including but not limited to metals, glass crockery, other mineral waste) and street rubbish;
 2. Furniture, appliances (including but not limited to ranges, TV's, microwaves, refrigerators, dishwashers, washing machines, dryers, room air conditioners, freezers, hot water heaters), automobile tires and wheels;
 3. Small amounts of sod, earth, ashes and rocks in containers not exceeding fifty (50) pounds each; and
 4. Home remodeling and repair construction materials or bundles not exceeding four (4) feet in length, not weighing over seventy-five (75) pounds per container or bundle;
 5. "Garbage and rubbish" does not include earth and wastes from building operation, solid wastes resulting from industrial processes and manufacturing operations such as food processing wastes, boiler house cinders, lumber, scraps and shavings.
- B. "Compostable Material" means grass, garden clippings and leaves.
- C. "Recyclable Materials" means aluminum cans, tin/steel cans, plastic soda pop bottles (PET), plastic colored laundry bottles, plastic milk jugs (HDPE), newspapers, magazines, phone books, catalogs, brown paper bags and glass bottles/containers.
- D. "Water/Waste Superintendent" means the "Water/Waste Superintendent" of the City of St. Charles, and his or her authorized agent.

- E. "Pre-paid Sticker" means a specially designated sticker bearing a logo depicted on Exhibit A to be attached (as an option to affixing a pre-paid bag) to items too large to fit in refuse bags, as a means for paying for disposal of said items."

2. THAT TITLE 8, "Health and Safety," Chapter 8.24 "Garbage and Refuse," of the St. Charles Municipal Code be and is hereby amended by deleting Section 8.24.020 "Approved Containers," and substituting the following therefore:

"8.24.020 Approved Containers.

- A. Types of approved containers
1. Containers to be used for the pickup of garbage and rubbish shall be:
 - a. Pre-paid disposable refuse bags, exclusively supplied by the city's refuse hauler, bearing a logo as depicted on Exhibit A, not less than 1.4 mil gauge plastic, and not exceeding a total weight when filled of fifty (50) pounds; or
 - b. Tightly covered metal or other non-corrodible material containers which are water-tight, do not exceed thirty-three (33) gallon capacity, and do not exceed a total weight when filled of fifty (50) pounds, and lined with a pre-paid disposable refuse bag/liner. Said containers (metal/other non-corrodible material) shall have secure handles for convenient lifting and carrying; or
 - c. Ninety (90) gallon mobile toters provided exclusively by the city's contracted refuse hauler clearly marked "Garbage and Rubbish Only."
 2. Containers to be used for the pickup of compostable materials shall be:
 - a. Pre-paid disposable refuse bags or liners clearly marked (color coded) for the disposal of compostable material, constructed of 1/50 natural Kraft, 1/50 wet strength printed with one color, one side water soluble ink and extra wet strength adhesive. Said bags shall be exclusively supplied by the city's contracted refuse hauler; or
 - b. A clearly marked ninety (90) gallon mobile toter used for the disposal of compostable materials provided exclusively by the city's contracted refuse hauler,
 3. "Recycling Bins/Bags": Containers to be used for the pickup of recyclable materials shall be made of non-corrodible materials, and made available through the city exclusively.
- B. Disposal in containers required
For single-family dwellings and multifamily dwelling units, it is unlawful to dispose of any recyclable material, garbage and rubbish or compostable material anywhere in the city except through placement of such

material in the types of approved containers described in Sec. 8.24.020 (A), and placed for collection as herein prescribed. The fee for such collection at single-family and multi-family dwelling units shall be such as are set from time to time by the city council. For commercial, industrial, school and other nonresidential establishments, it is unlawful to dispose of any garbage, refuse, compostable material, or recyclable material anywhere in the city except in an incinerator or disposal device, properly constructed and operated by a lawfully established garbage or refuse pickup service.

C. Commingling prohibited

No compostable material or garbage and rubbish (other than recyclable material) shall be placed in any recycling bin. No garbage and rubbish or recyclable material shall be placed in any containers designated for compostable materials (as defined in Section 8.24.020 (2)).

D. Replacement of recycling bins

Any damage to or loss of recycling bins shall be reported to the St. Charles Police Department by the primary user of the recycling bins or by the person responsible for the damage or loss within 24 hours of the damage or loss. The cost to repair or replace recycling bins damage or loss due to negligence shall be borne by the person responsible for the damage or loss.

E. Title to containers

All recycling bins and 90 gallon toters shall remain property of the city and the city's refuse hauler, respectively, and shall not be removed from the property on which the dwelling unit is located without the written consent of the Water/Waste Superintendent."

3. THAT TITLE 8, "Health and Safety," Chapter 8.24

"Garbage and Refuse," of the St. Charles Municipal Code be and is hereby amended by deleting Section 8.24.030 "Collection Services," and substituting the following therefore:

"8.24.030 Collection Services.

A. Location for pick-up

1. Dwellings of 4 or less units:

- a. All single-family dwellings and multi-family dwellings comprised of four (4) or less units (not in a complex of more than four total units) shall be picked up at curbside, unless otherwise authorized by the Water/Waste Superintendent or his designee.
- b. All containers shall be placed in a manner readily accessible for collection immediately behind the curb (i.e., on the parkway) at the street or at the alley lot line, as designated by the Water/Waste Superintendent no earlier than seven p.m. on the day preceding the day on which

collection is scheduled and no later than six a.m. on the day of collection. The empty containers shall be removed as soon as possible, but in no event later than seven p.m. on the day of collection.

2. Dwellings of more than 4 units: All multi-family dwellings comprised of more than four (4) units shall be provided a common garbage and refuse container, and a recyclable materials depository or a recycling bin (as designated by the Water/Waste Superintendent.

B. Routes and schedules

The routes and scheduled for collection of refuse and recyclable materials shall be depicted in Exhibit B."

4. THAT TITLE 8, "Health and Safety," Chapter 8.24

"Garbage and Refuse," of the St. Charles Municipal Code be and is hereby amended by deleting Section 8.24.040 "Charges and Bills," and substituting the following therefore:

"8.24.040 Charges and Bills.

- A. The charges for garbage and rubbish, compostable material and recyclable material collection service within the corporate limits of the city shall be as follows:


- B. One pre-paid bag or one pre-paid sticker (as defined herein) shall be securely and visibly attached to (a) every container containing sod, earth and/or rocks; (b) every bundle or container of home remodeling and repair construction materials, not to exceed 2 cubic yards; and (c) one pre-paid bag or sticker for every two automobile tires or automobile wheels, or pieces of furniture left out for collection.
- C. Bills for the collection of garbage and rubbish and recyclable material to multi-family dwellings over four units shall be sent out monthly. The due date of bills shall be fifteen days from the date of billing.
- D. Late payments shall include an additional ten percent charge."

5. That after the adoption and approval hereof, this Ordinance shall (a) be printed or published in book or pamphlet form, published by the authority of the City Council, or (b) within thirty (30) days after the adoption and approval hereof, be published in a newspaper published in and with a general circulation within the City of St. Charles.




