**An Ordinance Amending Title 10, "Vehicles and Traffic,"
Chapter 10.40.043, "No Parking on School Days,"
of the St. Charles Municipal Code**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES,
KANE AND DU PAGE COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:**

1. That Title 10, "Vehicles and Traffic," Chapter 10.40.043, "No Parking on School Days," of the St. Charles Municipal Code, be and is hereby amended by adding the following therefor:

C. Between the hours of 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on all streets inside the area bordered by and including Gray Street on the south from 4th Street to 12th Street, 4th Street on the east from Gray Street to Fellows, Fellows Street on the north from 4th Street to 12th Street and 12th Street on the west from Fellows to Gray.

2. That after the adoption and approval hereof the Ordinance shall (i) be printed or published in book or pamphlet form, published by the authority of the Council, or (ii) within thirty (30) days after the adoption and approval hereof, be published in a newspaper published in and with a general circulation within the City of St. Charles.

Re: Parking-Geneva High School Area

At the beginning of the 2005-6 school year, residents in the southwest area of the City adjacent to the Geneva High School raised complaints of students parking on the various streets in the area. It was determined that the City of Geneva had enacted an ordinance around the high school limiting parking to residents only. This caused students to look for alternatives, which led to residential streets in St. Charles adjacent to the area. That parking has led to a number of problems for St. Charles residents related to service delivery such as garbage pickup and seasonal services. Attempts to mitigate the problem without banning the parking have been unsuccessful.

The Police Department is recommending amending ordinance 10.40.043, No Parking on School Days, to include:

- C. Between the hours of 9:00 a.m. to 1: 00 p.m. on all streets inside the area bordered by and including Gray Street on the south from 4th Street to 12th Street, 4th Street on the east from Gray Street to Fellows, Fellows Street on the north from 4th Street to 12th Street and 12th street on the west from Fellows to Gray.

The Police Department is recommending approval of this change.
