

ORDINANCE NO. 1978-M-27

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 9, ARTICLE VI, ARTICLE VII AND ARTICLE X, OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF ST. CHARLES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES, KANE AND DUPAGE COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

1. That Chapter 9, Articles VI, VII and X of the Municipal Code of St. Charles are hereby deleted and the following substituted therefor:

ARTICLE VI

FIRE AND POLICE COMMISSIONERS

9.601 CREATED: COMPOSITION

There is hereby created a Board of Fire and Police Commissioners consisting of three members. They shall be officers of the municipality, as provided by statute.

9.602 APPOINTMENT: TERMS

The Board of Fire and Police Commissioners shall be appointed by the Mayor of the City by and with the consent of the City Council. The terms of office of the members of the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners shall be three years and until their respective successors shall be appointed and qualified, provided that no such appointments shall be made by any Mayor within thirty days before the expiration of his term of office, and provided, further, that the Mayor shall appoint the first members to such Board, one of whom is appointed to serve until the end of the current municipal year in which such appointment

is made, another shall serve until the end of the municipal year next ensuing, and the third shall serve until the end of the municipal year second next ensuing; provided, that each of the first members of the Board shall serve until his successor is appointed and qualified.

9.603 QUALIFICATIONS: OATH: BOND: REMOVAL

The members of the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners shall have such qualifications as are now or may hereafter be required of them by law. Each member of the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners shall take oath or affirmation of office, and shall execute and deliver to the City a bond in the sum of One Thousand Dollars, with such sureties as the Mayor and City Council shall approve, conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties of his office. The members of the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners shall be subject to removal from office in the same manner as other officers of the City.

9.604 POWERS AND DUTIES

The Board of Fire and Police Commissioners shall have such powers and duties as are now or as may hereafter be given to it by law.

9.605 COMPENSATION OF SECRETARY AND MEMBERS OF BOARD

The secretary of the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners shall be paid \$600.00 per year. All other members shall serve without pay.

ARTICLE VII

BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF
THE FIREMEN'S PENSION FUND

9.701 Creation) There shall be a Board of Trustees of the Firemen's Pension Fund which shall consist of the Fire Chief, the City Treasurer,

the City Clerk, the Comptroller, and three other persons who shall be chosen from the active firemen of the City, and one other person who shall be chosen from the retired firemen, as provided by statute. (Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 108½, paragraph 4-121) The members of the Board selected from the active and retired firemen shall be elected at the time and in the manner provided by statute.

- 9.702 Duties) The Board of Trustees of the Firemen's Pension Fund shall have control of the management of all funds belonging to or designated by law as part of the Firemen's Pension Fund or the administration of such funds, as provided by statute. (Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 108½, paragraphs 4-122 through 4-129.)

ARTICLE X

BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE POLICE PENSION FUND

- 9.1001 Creation) There shall be a Board of Trustees of the Police Pension Fund composed of five members. Of these members, two shall be appointed by the Mayor, two shall be elected from the regular police force of the City by the active members thereof, and one shall be elected by and from the beneficiaries of the fund. Each member shall serve for two years, and elected members shall be selected in the manner provided by law. (Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 108½, paragraph 3-128)
- 9.1002 Duties) It shall be the duty of the members of the Board of Trustees of the Police Pension Fund to manage, invest and control the police pension fund and all monies pertaining thereto in the manner provided by statute and to pay beneficiaries as provided by statute. (Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 108½, paragraphs 3-131 through 3-140).

9.1003 Funds) There shall be deposited in the Police Pension Fund the amounts provided for by statute.

2. That Chapter 9, Articles VI, VII and X of the Municipal Code of St. Charles, as hereinbefore and hereafter amended shall remain in full force and effect.

3. The current members of the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners and the current members of the Board of Trustees of the Firemen's Pension Fund (as heretofore designated) and the current members of the Board of Trustees of the Police Pension Fund (as heretofore designated) shall continue until their successors are selected according to the provisions of the ordinance hereinabove set forth.

4. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.


