BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES, KANE AND DU PAGE COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, as follows:

1. That Chapter 20 entitled "Animals," Article XIV entitled "Nuisances," Section 20.38 (4) be and is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefor:

"(4) Barking, whining, howling or otherwise emitting loud noises excessively for an extended and uninterrupted period while on the property of the owner or within the confines of the owner's residence or other enclosed building on the owner's property."


2. That any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$500.00 for each offense.

3. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in accordance with law.




