

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 5.08, "ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES", OF THE ST. CHARLES MUNICIPAL CODE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES, KANE AND DU PAGE COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

1. That Chapter 5.08, "Alcoholic Beverages", Section 5.08.080, "License - Classes and fees", of the St. Charles Municipal Code, be and is hereby amended by deleting Subparagraphs "N" and "O" and substituting the following therefor:

"N. Class N licenses shall authorize the retail sale of beer and wine to be consumed on the premises at a banquet, picnic, bazaar, fair or similar assembly where food is dispensed and only where the dispensing of food predominates, for a period of twenty-four hours or less, subject to the applicable closing hours provisions as set forth in this code. Such license shall be issued only to not-for-profit organizations. Each shall obtain a permit from the Illinois Liquor Control Commission. No more than six such licenses shall be issued to any organization within any three-hundred-sixty-five day period. No more than two Class N licenses shall be issued for any twenty-four-hour period. Evidence of adequate dram shop insurance and liability insurance (if for an out-of-doors license) issued by an insurance carrier approved by the Liquor Commissioner shall accompany any application for a license. There shall be a minimum of five liquor supervisors for every one hundred persons in attendance during the hours of the license. The liquor supervisors shall be members of the organization to which the license is issued and shall insure maintenance of the public peace. The fee for such license shall be ten dollars. The initial license fee of double the fee charged in the class shall not be applicable to a Class N license."

"O. Class O licenses shall authorize the retail sale of beer and wine to be consumed on the premises at a picnic, bazaar, fair or similar assembly where food is dispensed and only where the dispensing of food predominates for a period from twelve noon to midnight subject to the applicable provisions as set forth in this Code. Such license may be issued only to a class B, C, I or R licensee. In the event such license is for premises other than the licensed premises, the licensee shall

obtain a separate license or permit from the Illinois Liquor Control Commission for the premises on which the banquet, picnic, bazaar, fair or similar assembly is to be conducted. The licensee shall rope off the licensed premises, shall provide for pick-up of litter and trash, shall hand-stamp each patron being served after checking the identification of such patron, and shall provide no more than one glass of beer or wine per patron per order. Such banquet, picnic, bazaar, fair or similar assembly be conducted during a special event approved by the City Council. A sign limiting beer and wine to the premises shall be conspicuously displayed at all times. No more than two class O licenses shall be issued for any twenty-four hour period. Evidence of adequate dram shop insurance and liability insurance (if for an out-of-doors license) issued by an insurance carrier approved by the liquor commissioner shall accompany any application for a license. There shall be a minimum of five liquor supervisors for every one hundred persons in attendance during the hours of the license. The liquor supervisors shall insure maintenance of the public peace. The fee for such license shall be \$100.00. The initial license fee of double the fee charged in the class shall not be applicable to a class O license. The licensee shall otherwise comply with all of the application requirements of the St. Charles Municipal Code including Section 5.08.050 (6)."

2. That Chapter 5.08, "Alcoholic Beverages, Section 5.08.090, "License - Number to be issued", of the St. Charles Municipal Code, be and is hereby amended by deleting the same and substituting the following therefor:

"5.08.090 License - Number to be issued.


There shall be issued not more than a maximum of eight class A, sixteen class B, nine class C, one class D, one class E, three class F, and permitted supplementary license for class D license in any license year, six class I, plus one license for each of the special restricted classes as set forth in this chapter, plus twenty class N licenses, provided, no more than two such class N licenses shall be issued for any twenty-four hour period, plus no more than two class O for any twenty-four hour period, plus one class P license, plus one class R license."

3. That after the adoption and approval hereof the Ordinance shall (i) be printed or published in book or pamphlet form, published by the authority of the Council, or (ii) within thirty (30) days after the adoption and approval hereof, be published in a newspaper published in and with a general circulation within the City of St. Charles.
