

ORDINANCE NO. 1995-M-22

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 5.08, "ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES", OF THE ST. CHARLES MUNICIPAL CODE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES, KANE AND DU PAGE COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

1. That Chapter 5.08, "Alcoholic Beverages", Section 5.08.340, "Closing hours", of the St. Charles Municipal Code, be and is hereby amended by deleting the same and substituting the following therefor:

"5.08.340 Closing hours.

It is unlawful to keep open or permit to be open any place where alcoholic liquor is sold for consumption on the premises as follows:

- A. All establishments licensed under this chapter other than resort hotels or motels and class A license holders:
 - 1. Between the hours of one a.m. and seven a.m. of any weekday;
 - 2. Between the hours of one a.m. and noon of any Sunday except that restaurants holding class B, G and H license may sell only wine, including champagne, after ten o'clock (10:00 a.m.) on Sunday and before noon (12:00 p.m.) on Sunday, but only for consumption in the dining facilities of the licensee's restaurant in conjunction with and incidental to the purchase (for fair consideration) and consumption of a sit-down meal;
 - The exception to the foregoing hours will be that on New Year's Day, January 1st, it is lawful to keep open any place where alcoholic liquor is sold for consumption on the premises between the hours of midnight, December 31st, and three a.m. on January 1st.
- B. Special Hours for Resort Hotels or Motels. It is unlawful to keep open or permit to be open any place where alcoholic liquor is sold for consumption on the premises as follows:
 - 1. Between the hours of one a.m. and seven a.m. on Mondays;

- 2. Between the hours of two a.m. and seven a.m. on Tuesday through Friday;
- 3. Between the hours of three a.m. and seven a.m. on Saturday;
- 4. Between the hours of three a.m. and noon on Sunday except that restaurants located at such resort hotel or motel may sell alcoholic liquor after ten o'clock (10:00 a.m.) on Sunday and before noon (12:00 p.m.) on Sunday, but only for consumption in the dining facilities of the licensee's restaurant in conjunction with and incidental to the purchase (for fair consideration) and consumption of a sit-down meal;
- 5. The exception to the foregoing hours will be that on New Year's Day, January 1st, it is lawful to keep open any place where alcoholic liquor is sold for consumption on the premises between the hours of midnight, December 31st, and three a.m. on January 1st.
- C. All establishments having supplemental entertainment licenses are permitted to remain open until two a.m. on Sunday following any Saturday night they are providing live entertainment pursuant to this chapter.
- D. All class N license holders between the hours of midnight and seven a.m. and between the hours of eleven p.m. and midnight.
- E. All class O license holders between the hours of twelve midnight and twelve noon.
- F. All class Q license holders at all times except between 1:00 a.m. Saturday morning and 2:00 a.m. Saturday morning.
- G. All class R license holders between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 10:00 a.m. on all days except Sunday, between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and midnight on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday and between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and midnight on Friday and Saturday."
- 2. That after the adoption and approval hereof the Ordinance shall (i) be printed or published in book or pamphlet form, published by the authority of the Council, or (ii) within thirty (30) days after the adoption and approval hereof, be

published in a newspaper published in and with a general circulation within the City of St. Charles.
