ORDINANCE NO. 1997-M- 37

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 5, "LICENSES"
CHAPTER 5.08, "ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES",
OF THE ST. CHARLES MUNICIPAL CODE**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES,
KANE AND DU PAGE COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:**

1. That Title 5, "Licenses" Chapter 5.08, "Alcoholic Beverages", Section 5.08.080, "License - Classes and fees", of the St. Charles Municipal Code, be and is hereby amended by deleting Subsection "H" and substituting the following therefor:

- "H. Class H, special restricted license, shall authorize the retail sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption solely on the premises when such retail sale is made by the person who operates the hotel. In addition to the regular restrictions and penalties, this license is further subject to the following restrictions:
1. Restricted Term and Renewal. This license and classification will automatically expire after operations at the Hotel Baker located at 100 West Main Street, St. Charles, Illinois, cease.
 2. Fee. The annual fee shall be one thousand six hundred dollars.
 3. Number of licenses. There will be only one class H license in any license year.
 4. Change of Location. This license is not to be removed from the location at 100 West Main Street, St. Charles, Illinois, without the approval of the city council and the consent of the local liquor control commissioner.
 5. Service Bar Restrictions. This classification shall permit a general service bar in the Charlemagne Room. Four restricted service bars shall be permitted, one in the trophy room, a second in the rainbow room, a third in the boat house and fenced in patio area and a fourth in the Writing Room. A restricted service bar is a permanent or portable bar which contains alcoholic liquor, mixes and related paraphernalia which are used in the preparation of alcoholic drinks. A restricted service bar, further, does not and shall not have

seats or stools or other places for persons to sit or stand while drinking an alcoholic beverage. A restricted service bar is solely to be used for the preparation and disbursement of drinks to be consumed at the food service tables or other locations away from the bar.


6. Residence Room Mini-bars. Each of the residence rooms may have a mini-bar that may be accessed only by a special key obtained from the hotel management by a patron that may be served alcoholic liquors without violating the provisions of Sections 5.08.260, 5.08.270 and 5.08.280 of this chapter.”

2. That after the adoption and approval hereof the Ordinance shall (i) be printed or published in book or pamphlet form, published by the authority of the Council, or (ii) within thirty (30) days after the adoption and approval hereof, be published in a newspaper published in and with a general circulation within the City of St. Charles; provided, however, that this Ordinance shall not become effective before May 1, 1997.


