



**Ordinance No. 1998-M- 98**

**An Ordinance Amending Title 5, "Business Licenses and Regulations,"  
Chapter 5.08, "Alcoholic Beverages,"  
Section 5.08.080, "License – Classes and Fees,"  
of the St. Charles Municipal Code**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES, KANE  
AND DU PAGE COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:**

1. That Title 5, "Business Licenses and Regulations," Chapter 5.08, "Alcoholic Beverages," Section 5.08.080, "License – Classes and Fees," Paragraph S, of the St. Charles Municipal Code, be and is hereby amended by deleting the same and substituting the following therefore:

- S. Class S licenses shall authorize the retail sale of bottled wine or champagne to be sold exclusively as part of an arrangement in a gift basket by an establishment in which the retail sale of bottled wine and champagne is not the primary and principal business thereof.
  - 1. In addition to other requirements of this Chapter, a Class S license shall only be issued to persons who can demonstrate that they are operating a bona fide business in which the wine/champagne gift basket business is incidental to the sale of other products.
  - 2. Wine and champagne shall be sold in sealed packages only and consumption on the premises where sold is not permitted.
  - 3. For purposes of this license classification, a basket shall be defined as a decorative gift container which may be constructed of wood, metal, plastic, woven rope, decorative paper or plastic bag or such similar material, the purpose of which is to hold the gift bottle arrangement.
  - 4. No more than two bottles of wine or champagne shall be included in any basket.
  - 5. The annual license fee for a Class S license shall be Five Hundred Dollars (\$500), but the initial double license fee described in Sections 5.04.060 and 5.08.080 shall not apply to the Class S license.

2. That after the adoption and approval hereof the Ordinance shall (i) be printed or published in book or pamphlet form, published by the authority of the Council, or (ii) within thirty (30) days after the adoption and approval hereof, be published in a newspaper published in and with a general circulation within the City of St. Charles.


I further certify that on November 2, 1998, the Corporate Authorities of such municipality passed and approved Ordinance No. 1998-M-98, entitled
