ORDINANCE NO. 2000-M- 22

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 2
“ADMINISTRATION AND PERSONNEL” CHAPTER 2.32
“POLICE DEPARTMENT” SECTIONS 2.32.0100 “CREATED-COMPOSITION”
AND SECTION 2.32.020 “APPOINTMENTS AND PROMOTIONS”
OF THE ST. CHARLES MUNICIPAL CODE**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. CHARLES,
KANE AND DUPAGE COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:**

1. That Title 2 “Administration and Personnel” Chapter 2.32 “Police Department” Section 2.32.010 “Created-Composition” of the St. Charles Municipal Code be amended to read as follows:

There is created a Police Department, an executive department of the city. The Police Department shall consist of the Chief of Police, three section commanders, three shift commanders, five sergeants, thirty-seven patrol officers, and such other members that may be provided for from time to time by the mayor and city council. All appointed police officers of the Police Department, including the Chief of Police, are to be considered employees of the city.

2. That Title 10 “Administration and Personnel” Chapter 2.32 “Police Department” Section 2.32.020 “Appointments and Promotions” of the St. Charles Municipal Code. be amended as follows:

- A. Except as hereinafter set forth, all appointments and promotions to the police department shall be made by the board of fire and police commissioners as provided for by law.
- B. The chief of police shall be appointed by the mayor for the term of one year or until his or her successor is appointed, commencing May 1 of each year, with such appointment to be confirmed by the city council.

C.

1. The chief of police is authorized to appoint, suspend or discharge the three section commanders or shift commanders subject to the advice and consent of the city administrator. In the event the chief of police discharges a section commander or shift commander, said officer shall revert to his or her permanent rank, if any, in the police department as established under statute or city ordinance. A section commander or shift commander of policy may be appointed from the officers of the St. Charles Police Department, and while such officer shall hold the position of section commander or shift commander, his position as a permanent officer within the department shall remain open.

2. The City Administrator is authorized to appoint, suspend or discharge a police commander as the Coordinator for the City's Emergency Services and Disaster Agency subject to the advice and consent of the city council. In the event the city administrator discharges a commander, said officer shall revert to his or her permanent rank, if any, in the police department as established under statute or city ordinance. A commander shall be appointed from the officers of the St. Charles Police Department, and while such officer shall hold the position of commander, his position as a permanent officer within the department shall remain open.

D. Any regular member of the police department appointed as chief of police, section commander or shift commander shall be classified during his or her term in such position as on furlough from the police department at the rank to which he or she is entitled under the board of fire and police commission at the beginning of his or her term of office, he or she shall be returned to active duty as a regular member at his or her rank and seniority and shall thereafter be entitled to all the benefits and emoluments of such prior rank with regard to whether a vacancy exists in such rank.


3. That after the adoption and approval hereof, this Ordinance shall (i) be printed or published in book or pamphlet form published by the authority of the Council, or (ii) within thirty (30) days after the adoption and approval hereof, be published in a newspaper published in and with a general circulation within the City of St. Charles.

4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by a vote of the majority of the corporate authorities now holding office and approval in the manner provided by law.


